1st Case: Mac' Allan Ltee

Date case filed: 09 October 2021

- Count I: Locating a lodging accommodation in same building as place of work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.
- 2nd Case: Fortress Marketing Company Ltd

Date case filed: 14 September 2020

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3rd Case: Freeport Operations (Mauritius) Limited

Date case filed: 26 August 2021

- Count I: Failing, so far as is reasonably practicable, to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs9,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.
- 4th Case: Fortune Eight Restaurant Ltd

Date case filed: 27 May 2021

- Count I: Failing to, within 30 days of the start of operation of his undertaking, make a suitable and sufficient assessment of any risk to the safety and health to which any employee is exposed whilst he is at work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to carry out a fire drill at least once a year in all places of work requiring a fire certificate, according to an established fire and emergency plan approved by the Mauritius Fire and Rescue Service. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

5th Case: Square Deal Multipurpose Cooperation Society Ltd

Date case filed: 05 February 2021

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

6th Case: Reshma&Avi Co- Limited

Date case filed: 27 May 2021

Count I: Failing to make a suitable and sufficient assessment of any risk to the safety and health to which any employee is exposed whilst he is at work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs4,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

7th Case: Municipal Council of Quatre Bornes

Date case filed: 25 October 2017

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety and health of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs9,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.
