12th Case: Ramasawmy & Ramasawmy Co Ltd

Rs3,500/-.

Count II: Failing to ensure that a scaffold is effectively braced by means of longitudinal

and transverse bracing systems which extend from the base to the top of the scaffold. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both

cases.

for both cases.

15th Case: Afix Scaff (Mauritius) Ltd

Date case filed: 27 January 2021

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety and health at work of its employees. Was

sentenced to a fine of Rs15,000/- and cost of Rs200/.

16th Case: AKGM Contracting Limited

Date case filed: 27 May 2022

Count I: Failing to notify an accident at work by the quickest practicable means. Was

sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/-.

Count II: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a

fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both cases.
