Cases in which judgement delivered

1st Case: Martinson Company Ltd

Date case filed: 23 February 2026

Count I: Causing a scaffold, except an excluded scaffold, to be erected without holding a permit or enlisting the services of a scaffold contractor. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

2nd Case: Prashantex Ltd

Date case filed: 04 December 2025

Count I: Failing to cause the goods lift No. 1 of make MISIA bearing serial number 130134 to be thoroughly examined by a Registered Machinery Inspector at least once every 6 months. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to send the original report of the result of the examination done on the 29th March 2023 of goods lift No. 1 of make MISIA bearing serial number 130134 in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 28 days of the completion of the examination. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count III: Failing to cause the goods lift No. 2 of make MISIA bearing serial number 130410 to be thoroughly examined by a Registered Machinery Inspector at least once every 6 months. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

3rd Case: Joyessur Agricultural Company Ltd

Date case filed: 06 March 2026

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

4th Case: Care Keen Cleaning Ltd

Date case filed: 06 March 2026

Count I: Failing to carry out risk assessment. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/-.

Count II: Failing to employ a Safety and Health Officer. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

5th Case: Terragri Ltd

Date case filed: 16 June 2022

Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Count dismissed.

Count II: Failing to notify the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department of an accident arising out of work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/-.

Count III: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

6th Case: Livestock Feed Limited

Date case filed: 26 April 2022

Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Case dismissed.

7th Case: Innodis Ltd

Date case filed: 19 December 2017

Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

8th Case: Lotao Edify Construction Ltd

Date case filed: 24 February 2026

Count I: Causing a scaffold, except an excluded scaffold, to be constructed, erected, installed, re-positioned, altered, maintained, repaired or dismantled without holding a Scaffold Contractor's Permit or enlisting the services of a scaffold contractor. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

9th Case: Terragri Ltd

Date case filed: 22 February 2023

Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs7,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

10th Case: C-Care (Mauritius) Ltd

Date case filed: 16 January 2025

Count I: Failing to apply in writing to the Permanent Secretary for Factory Building Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

11th Case: Zoza Trading Ltd

Date case filed: 11 December 2025

Count I: Operating a factory without it being registered. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

12th Case: Windoors Professional Ltd

Date case filed: 11 December 2025

Count I: Failing to make a suitable and sufficient risk assessment of any risk to the safety and health to which any employee is exposed whilst he is at work within 30 days of the start of operation of his undertaking. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/-.

- Count II: Failing to establish Safety and Health Committees where the number of employees is 50 or more. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.
- 13th Case: Air Builders Ltd**
- Date case filed: 28 January 2026
- Count I: Failing to cause every open side of building from which persons are liable to fall a distance of more than 2 metres to be adequately fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.
- 14th Case: Square Deal Multi-Purpose Co-operative Society Limited**
- Date case filed: 28 January 2026
- Count I: Failing to cause every open side of building from which persons are liable to fall a distance of more than 2 metres to be adequately fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.
- 15th Case: Top Security Services Ltd**
- Date case filed: 28 January 2026
- Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs8,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to forthwith notify the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department of an accident arising out of work or in connection with work by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs8,000/-.
- Count III: Failing to send a report within 7 days in the form set out in the Thirteenth Schedule to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.
- 16th Case: SHEENTEX LTD**
- Date case filed: 28 January 2026
- Count I: Failing to hold safety and health committee meeting during normal working hours at least once every 2 months or at any earlier time at the request of any representative of the employer or employees on that committee. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to forward written record of proceedings of safety and health committee meeting to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.
- 17th Case: Central Electricity Board**
- Date case filed: 28 January 2026
- Count I: Failing to forward written record of proceedings of safety and health committee meeting to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to forward written record of proceedings of safety and health committee meeting to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

18th Case: ALCEDO LTD

Date case filed: 28 January 2026

Count I: Failing to forward written record of proceedings of safety and health committee meeting to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

19th Case: ALCEDO LTD

Date case filed: 28 January 2026

Count I: Failing to forward written record of proceedings of safety and health committee meeting to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of R1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to forward written record of proceedings of safety and health committee meeting to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count III: Failing to forward written record of proceedings of safety and health committee meeting to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.
