1st Case: Tourism Authority

Count I: Failing to provide first aid box. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

2nd Case: Tourism Authority

Count I: Failing to employ a Safety and Health Officer. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3rd Case: Simla Supermarket Co Ltd

Count I: Requiring employees to work in premises in respect of which a fire certificate is required without such certificate being in force. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

4th Case: Morning Light Co Ltd (Hilton)

Count I: Failing to ensure safety and health at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs25,000/-.

Count II: Failing to notify the Director, Occupational Safety and Health by the quickest practicable means of an accident at work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs35,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.
