Count I: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

4th Case: University of Technology, Mauritius

Date case filed: 17 November 2017

- Count I: Failing to carry out fire drill. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/-.
- Count II: Failing to establish Safety and Health Committee. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/-.

Count I: Failing to attend at the time and place specified in a summons. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs600/- and cost of Rs200/-.

Count I: Using a lodging accommodation without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,800/- and cost of Rs200/-.

12th Case: Furnitech Ltd

Date case filed: 27 July 2023

- Count I: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both cases.
