Health Act 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

Date case filed: 26 November 2020

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding

a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of

the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

10th Case: Beijing Construction Engineering Group Co Ltd

access from one level of a scaffold to another level. Was sentenced to a fine of

and transverse bracing systems which extend from the base to the top of the

scaffold. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/-.
