1st Case: Bychemex Ltd

Date case filed: **10 February 2025**

- Count I: Failing to forward the report of a hoist as in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 28 days of the completion of the examination. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to forward the report of a hoist as in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 28 days of the completion of the examination. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

2nd Case: Bychemex Ltd

Date case filed: **10 February 2025**

- Count I: Failing to forward the report of an air receiver as in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 28 days of the completion of the examination. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to forward the report of an air receiver as in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 28 days of the completion of the examination. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.
- Count III: Failing to forward the report of an air receiver as in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 28 days of the completion of the examination. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

3rd Case: Bychemex Ltd

Date case filed: **10 February 2025**

- Count I: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to send to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within seven days, a report of an accident. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

4th Case: Atelier Deco Ltee

Date case filed: **27 May 2025**

- Count I: Operating factory without it being registered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to cause air receiver to be examined by a Registered Machinery Inspector. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.
- Count III: Failing to cause air receiver to be examined by a Registered Machinery Inspector. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

5th Case: DLB Construction & Co Ltd

Date case filed: **27 May 2025**

Count I: Failing to ensure that any work platform does not have any opening except to allow access to that work platform. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-

6th Case: DLB Construction & Co Ltd

Date case filed: **27 May 2025**

Count I: Failing to provide stairs or ladders to enable person to gain access from one level of scaffold to next. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs41,000/-.

Count II: Failing to provide bracing. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/-.

Count III: Failing to provide toeboards or guardrails. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

7th Case: Florecold Industry Ltd

Date case filed: **23 May 2021**

Count I: Failing to hold Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-

8th Case: Societe Singaron Poinen & Cie

Date case filed: **02 May 2025**

Count I: Failing to provide a device which automatically prevents the operator from coming into contact with dangerous part of machinery. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to cause a building used as place of work to be watertight. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

9th Case: Societe Singaron Poinen & Cie

Date case filed: **02 May 2025**

Count I: Failing to fence dangerous part of machinery. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to fence dangerous part of machinery. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

10th Case: Shanxi Construction Engineering Group Co Ltd

Date case filed: **11 December 2023**

Count I: Failing to keep a register at the workplace where there is a scaffold. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to provide designated access to scaffold. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-

Count III: Failing to provide bracing. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

11th Case: Shanxi Construction Engineering Group Co Ltd

Date case filed: **11 December 2023**

Count I: Failing to ensure that work platform does not have opening. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to provide toe-board or guardrails. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

12th Case: BVADATA LTD

Date case filed: **28 February 2025**

Count I: Failing to provide and maintain a messroom furnished with tables and chairs or benches with backrest, sufficient for the number of employees remaining on the premises during meal intervals. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-

13th Case: Rogers Hospitality Operations Ltd

Date case filed: **27 July 2023**

Count I: Failing to ensure safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Case dismissed.
