Count I: Failing to provide and maintain a messroom furnished with tables and chairs or

benches with backrest, sufficient for the number of employees remaining on the premises during meal intervals. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of

Rs200/-

13th Case: Rogers Hospitality Operations Ltd

Date case filed: 27 July 2023

Count I: Failing to ensure safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Case dismissed.
