- Count I: Failing to forward a written record of proceedings of the Safety and Health Committee to the Director, Occupational Safety and Health within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/-.
- Count II: Failing to forward a written record of proceedings of the Safety and Health Committee to the Director, Occupational Safety and Health within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

12th Case: Information Technology Elca Ltd
