## CASES IN WHICH JUDGEMENT DELIVERED

**1<sup>st</sup> Case:** **Square Deal Multipurpose Cooperative Society Limited**

Date case filed: 25 May 2025

Count I: Failing to provide each employee with a suitable wardrobe or locker in his bedroom. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Case:** **Eurocasting Ltd**

Date case filed: 25 May 2025

Count I: Failing to apply in writing to the Permanent Secretary for a Factory Building Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

**3<sup>rd</sup> Case:** **SUPER CONSTRUCTION CO LTD**

Date case filed: 29 May 2025

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

**4<sup>th</sup> Case:** **DHL (Mauritius) Ltd**

Date case filed: 29 May 2025

Count I: Failing to forward a written record of proceedings of Safety and Health Committee to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to forward a written record of proceedings of Safety and Health Committee to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

**5<sup>th</sup> Case:** **DHL (Mauritius) Ltd**

Date case filed: 29 May 2025

Count I: Failing to forward a written record of proceedings of Safety and Health Committee to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to forward a written record of proceedings of Safety and Health Committee to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department within 10 days of the meeting. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

**6<sup>th</sup> Case:** **Froid des Mascareignes**

Date case filed: 19 August 2021

Count I: Failing, so far as is reasonably practicable, to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs10,000/-.

Count II: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

**7<sup>th</sup> Case: VK & K'S SUPERMARKET LTD**

Date case filed: 07 August 2025

Count I: Failing to make a suitable and sufficient assessment of any risk to the safety and health to which any employee is exposed whilst he is at work within 30 days of the start of operation. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-

**8<sup>th</sup> Case: Vishal Ozeer**

Date case filed: 07 August 2025

Count I: Failing to notify the Permanent Secretary, in writing of the date on which the scaffold supervisor ceased employment, within 14 days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-

**9<sup>th</sup> Case: Mr. Johnson Matadeen**

Date case filed: 07 August 2025

Count I: Failing to provide to a group of employees who are collectively engaged in work at height, a collective fall protection system to ensure the collective safety of such employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-

**10<sup>th</sup> Case: Esquel Mauritius Ltd**

Date case filed: 24 May 2018

Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees.

Count II: Failing to cause the electric pallet truck to be thoroughly examined by a Registered Machinery Inspector. Case dismissed.
