Cases in which judgement delivered

Annex

1st Case: Vivo Energy Mauritius Ltd

Date case filed: 22 December 2023

Count I: Failing to apply for Factory Building Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to apply for Factory Building Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

2nd Case: Island Fresh Ltd

Date case filed: 17 May 2023

Count I: Failing to ensure that the safety, health and welfare at work of all his employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3rd Case: Manser Saxon and Beijing Construction Engineering Group Co Ltd

Date case filed: 29 May 2025

Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs20,000/-.

Count II: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, in particular, ensure that any person not in his employment is not exposed to any risk to his safety or health. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs20,000/-

Count III: Failing to ensure that any person working in his undertaking, other than the employee of the employer, is provided with appropriate instructions and adequate information. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs20,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

4th Case: Square Deal Multi-Purpose Cooperative Society Limited

Date case filed: 30 July 2025

Count I: Failing to ensure that the scaffold is effectively braced by means of longitudinal and transverse bracing systems which extends from the base to the top of the scaffold. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,500/-.

Count II: Failing to ensure that every side of a work platform from which a person is liable to fall more than 2 meters is provided with toe-boards and 2 or more guardrails. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,500/-

Count III: Failing to cause every open side of floors form which persons are liable to fall a distance of more than 2 metres, to be adequately fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

5th Case: Systems Building Contracting Ltd

Date case filed: 30 July 2025

Count I: Failing to cause every open side of floors form which persons are liable to fall a distance of more than 2 metres, to be adequately fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

6th Case: Nundun Gopee & Company Limited

Date case filed: 03 June 2025

Count I: Failing to cause the circular sawing machine to be provided with a riving knife behind and in direct line with the saw blade of the machine. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to cause the part of the saw of the circular sawing machine which is above the machine table to be provided with a strong and easily adjustable guard. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

7th Case: Nundun Gopee & Company Limited

Date case filed: 03 June 2025

Count I: Failing to employ a Safety and Health Officer being an employer of 100 or more but less than 500 whether on a part-time or full-time basis. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to cause the gate of the construction hoist to be fitted with an efficient interlocking device. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-

Count III: Causing a scaffold, except an excluded scaffold, to be erected without holding a permit or enlisting the services of a scaffold contractor. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

8th Case: Central Water Authority

Date case filed: 02 May 2025

Count I: Failing to provide for use, in case of emergency, by such employee, conveniently suitable and marked suitable facilities for flushing the eye. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

9th Case: Central Water Authority

Date case filed: 02 May 2025

Count I: Failing to provide for use, in case of emergency, by such employee, conveniently suitable and marked suitable facilities for flushing the eye. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-

10th Case: Precigraph Limited

Date case filed: 16 November 2022

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs7,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

Count II: Failing to notify an accident to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department by the quickest practicable means. Count II dismissed.

11th Case: Compagnie Mauricienne de Textile Ltee

Date case filed: 10 August 2017

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all his employees. Case dismissed.

12th Case: Indian Ocean Packaging Ltd

Date case filed: 22 November 2022

Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Count I dismissed.

Count II: Failing to forthwith notify an accident to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department by the quickest practicable means. Count II dismissed.

Count III: Failing to send to the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department, report of an accident. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

13th Case: United Bus Services Ltd

Date case filed: 10 January 2023

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all his employees. Case dismissed.

14th Case: Les Moulins de la Concorde Ltee

Date case filed: 10 November 2022

Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of all his employees. Case dismissed.
