Count I: Using a building as lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

4th Case: Akhilesh International Limited

Count I: Using a building as lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

5th Case: Water Rain Co Ltd

Count I: Operating a factory without it being registered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005 – Act No. 28 of 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

6th Case: Merigault Didier Limited

Count I: Operating a factory without it being registered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005 – Act No. 28 of 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

7th Case: M.S. Jaffoo Enterprise Limited

Count I: Using a building as lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,600/- and cost of Rs200/-.

8th Case: National Transport Corporation

Count I: Failing to notify an accident to the Director, Occupational Safety and Health by quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

9th Case: Soap & Allied Industries Ltd

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs8,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

10th Case: Rehm Grinaker Construction Co Ltd

Count I: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

11th Case: Cube Design Ltd

Count I: Failing so far as is reasonably practicable to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs8,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

12th Case: Reso Green Ltd

Count I: Failing to, within 30 days of the start of operation of his undertaking, make a suitable and sufficient assessment of any risk to the safety and health to which any employee is exposed whilst he is at work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-

Count II: Operating a factory without it being registered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.
