1st Case: National Transport Corporation

Date case filed: 27 January 2021

- Count I: Failing to notify an accident at work by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to send report of an accident at work within 7 days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

2nd Case: Fairy Textiles Limited

Date case filed: 27 January 2021

- Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.
- 3rd Case: Louis Hung King Sang

Date case filed: 27 May 2021

- Count I: Operating a factory without it being registered. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.
- 4th Case: Tianli Construction Co Ltd

Date case filed: 26 November 2020

- Count I: Failing to appoint a first aider at its place of work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/-.
- Count II: Failing to keep a scaffold register. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.
- 5th Case: Rehm Grinaker Construction Co Ltd

Date case filed: 11 June 2021

Count I: Failing to notify an accident at work by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

6th Case: Henan Water & Power Engineering Consulting (Mtius) Ltd

Date case filed: 21 December 2020

Count I: Failing to cause all parts and working gear, whether fixed or movable, including the anchoring and fixing appliances of a lifting machine to be thoroughly examined by a registered machine inspector at least once every 12 months. Case struck out on 28 October 2021.

7th Case: Henan Water & Power Engineering Consulting (Mtius) Ltd

Date case filed: 21 December 2020

- Count I: Failing to ensure that stairs or ladders are provided to enable persons to gain access from one level of a scaffold to another level.
- Count II: Failing to ensure that a work platform is securely fastened in place by cleats or such other means of fastening so as to prevent movement.
- Count III: Failing to ensure that every side of a work platform from which a person is liable to fall more than 2 metres is provided with toe-boards and 2 or more guardrails. Case struck out on 28 October 2021.

8th Case: Rehm Grinaker Construction Co Ltd

Date case filed: 09 July 2021

- Count I: Failing to notify an accident at work by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs4,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.
- 9th Case: Velogic Haulage Services Ltd

Date case filed: 26 August 2021

- Count I: Failing to notify an accident at work by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.
- 10th Case: Oak Management Mauritius Ltd

Date case filed: 21 December 2020

- Count I: Failing to notify an accident at work by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to send report of an accident at work within 7 days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

11th Case: Rehm Grinaker Construction Co Ltd

Date case filed: 27 January 2021

- Count I: Failing to ensure that all metal decking used in the construction of work platforms are flushed along their lengths and effectively secured to prevent tipping or uplift. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/-.
- Count II: Failing to ensure that every side of a work platform from which a person is liable to fall more than 2 metres is provided with toe-boards and 2 or more guardrails. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/-.
- Count III: Failing to cause every opening in floors through which persons are liable to fall, to be adequately fenced or boarded over. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

12th Case: Rehm Grinaker Construction Co Ltd

Date case filed: 27 January 2021

- Count I: Failing to ensure that every scaffold including each member of component thereof is of good construction. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/-.
- Count II: Failing to ensure that the scaffold is effectively braced by means of longitudinal transverse bracing systems which extends from the base to the top of the scaffold. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/-.
- Count III: Failing to ensure that a work platform is securely fastened in place by cleats or such other means of fastening so as to prevent movement. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

13th Case: Tianli Construction Company Ltd

Date case filed: 24 September 2020

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

14th Case: Square Deal Multipurpose Cooperation Society Ltd

Date case filed: 05 February 2021

Count I: Failing to employ a Safety and Health Officer being an employer of more than 500 employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

15th Case: Omrise Ltd

Date case filed: 04 September 2020

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

16th Case: Chantier Naval de L'Ocean Indien Limited

Date case filed: 05 February 2021

Count I: Failing at least 30 days before commencing construction of a building appurtenant to a factory to apply in writing to the Permanent Secretary for a Factory Building Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

17th Case: Fine Touch Limited

Date case filed: 18 February 2021

- Count I: Causing a scaffold, except an excluded scaffold, to be constructed, erected, installed, re-positioned, altered, maintained, repaired or dismantled without holding a permit or enlisting the services of a scaffold contractor. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/-.
- Count II: Failing to ensure that stairs or ladders are provided to enable persons to gain access from one level of a scaffold to another level. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/-.
- Count III: Failing to ensure that any work platform provided does not have any opening except to allow access to that work platform. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

18th Case: Fine Touch Limited

Date case filed: 18 February 2021

- Count I: Failing to ensure that a work platform is securely fastened in place by cleats or such other means of fastening so as to prevent movement. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/-.
- Count II: Failing to ensure that all planks used in the construction of work platforms are flushed along their lengths and effectively secured to prevent tipping or uplift. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

19th Case: Construction Plant Hire Ltd

Date case filed: 24 June 2021

Count I: Failing to, within 30 days of the coming into operation of the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005 – Act No. 28 of 2005, make a risk assessment in respect of his undertaking. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

20th Case: Hassen Sowdayer

Date case filed: 24 June 2021

Count I: Operating a factory without it being registered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005 – Act No. 28 of 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

21st Case: Beijing Construction Engineering Group Co Ltd

Date case filed: 27 January 2021

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

22th Case: AKGM Contracting Ltd

Date case filed: 29 July 2021

- Count I: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/-.
- Count II: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.
