Date case filed: 28 July 2022

Count I: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced

to a fine of Rs10,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

2<sup>nd</sup> Case: GME Ltd

Date case filed: 12 November 2020

Count I: Using a building as lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a

Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost

of Rs200/-.

3<sup>rd</sup> Case: The City Council of Port Louis

Date case filed: 24 November 2021

Count I: Failing to provide at suitable points conveniently accessible to all employees an

adequate supply of wholesome drinking water. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs2,000/-.

Count II: Failing to provide for the use of employees adequate and suitable facilities for

washing which shall include a supply of clean water, soap, clean towels or other means for cleaning and drying. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost

of Rs200/- for both counts.

4th Case: Fakeerah Dario

Date case filed: 16 November 2022

Count I: Failing to ensure safety and health of employees. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs40,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

5<sup>th</sup> Case: Beijing Construction Engineering Group Co Ltd

Date case filed: 20 May 2022

Count I: Failing, so far as is reasonably practicable, to ensure the safety, health and

welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs10,000/-.

Count II: Failing to notify an accident by quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a

fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count III: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a

fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

6<sup>th</sup> Case: Central Electricity Board

Date case filed: 30 December 2022

Count I: Failing to notify an accident by quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a

fine of Rs2,000/-.

Count II: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a

fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

7<sup>th</sup> Case: Grays Distilling Ltd

Date case filed: 22 December 2022

Count I: Failing to ensure safety and health of employees. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs1,300/- and cost of Rs200/-.

8th Case: Consolidated Fabrics Ltd

Date case filed: 19 December 2017

Count I: Failing to ensure safety and health of employees. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs6,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

9<sup>th</sup> Case: Hyvec Partners Ltd

Date case filed: 10 February 2021

Count I: Failing to ensure that stairs or ladders are provided to enable persons to gain

access from one level of a scaffold to another level. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs500/-.

Count II: Failing to ensure that a work platform is securely fastened in place by cleats or

such other means of fastening so as to prevent movement. Was sentenced to a

fine of Rs500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

10th Case: Hyvec Partners Ltd

Date case filed: 10 February 2021

Count I: Failing to ensure that any work platform does not have any opening except to

allow access to that work platform. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/-.

Count II: Failing to ensure that every side of a work platform from which a person is liable

to fall more than 2 metres is provided with toe-boards and 2 or more guardrails.

Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

11th Case: Bhimajee Govinda Construction Ltd

Date case filed: 23 April 2015

Count I: Failing to ensure that every platform of a scaffold is boarded in such a way as to

prevent tools and materials from falling through. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs900/-.

Count II: Causing a scaffold to be used without it being securely and effectively braced.

Was sentenced to a fine of Rs900/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

12<sup>th</sup> Case: Hyvec Partners Ltd

Date case filed: 10 February 2021

Count I: Failing to cause the open side from which persons are liable to fall to be

adequately fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs800/- and cost of Rs200/-.
