CASES IN WHICH JUDGEMENT DELIVERED

1st Case: Beijing Construction Engineering Group Co Ltd

Date case filed: 30 July 2025

Count I: Failing to ensure that the scaffold is effectively braced by means of longitudinal and transverse bracing systems which extends from the base to the top of the scaffold. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/-.

Count II: Failing to ensure that each side of a work platform from which a person is liable to fall more than 2 meters is provided with toe-boards and 2 or more guardrails. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs4,000/-

Count III: Failing to ensure that there is no opening in the work platform of the metal scaffold, except to allow access to that work platform. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

2nd Case: Beijing Construction Engineering Group Co Ltd

Date case filed: 30 July 2025

Count I: Failing to ensure every open side of floors from which persons are liable to fall a distance of more than 2 metres, to be adequately fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3rd Case: Denis Josue Kasamun

Date case filed: 30 July 2025

Count I: Causing a scaffold, except an excluded scaffold, to be erected without holding a permit, or enlisting the services of a scaffold contractor. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

4th Case: Hermes Properties Ltd

Date case filed: 25 September 2025

Count I: Construction of a factory or a building appurtenant to a factory without a Factory Building Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

5th Case: The District Council of Flacq

Date case filed: 19 August 2020

Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs7,000/-.

Count II: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs700/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

6th Case: Marine Biotechnology Products Ltd

Date case filed: 30 June 2022

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

7th Case: Bacotex Limited

Date case filed: 30 July 2025

Count I: Using a lodging accommodation located in the same building as the factory. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

8th Case: SDY Trading Ltd

Date case filed: 17 December 2024

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs20,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

9th Case: Al Rashid Industrial Bakery Ltd

Date case filed: 25 March 2025

Count I: Failing to notify accident by quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/-.

Count II: Failing to send report within 7 days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/ for both counts.

10th Case: Municipal Council of Beau Bassin Rose Hill

Date case filed: 24 August 2017

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

11th Case: G.D & Villiers Paint Contractors Ltd

Date case filed: 25 September 2025

Count I: Failing to provide ladders or stairs to enable person to gain access from one level of scaffold to next. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

12th Case: La Vallee Scaf Co Ltd

Date case filed: 25 September 2025

Count I: Failing to hold Scaffold Contractor's Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

13th Case: China Jiangsu International Economic-Technical Cooperation Corporation Group Ltd

Date case filed: 25 September 2025

Count I: Failing to ensure that platform does not have opening. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

14th Case: China Jiangsu International Economic-Technical Cooperation Corporation Group Ltd

Date case filed: 25 September 2025

Count I: Failing to provide ladders or stairs to enable person to gain access from one level of scaffold to next. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to cause scaffold to be effectively braced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-

Count III: Failing to provide toe-boards and 2 or more guardrails. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

15th Case: District Council of Black River

Date case filed: 31 January 2025

Count I: Failing to provide proper changing room. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/-.

Count II: Failing to provide adequate facilities for taking of meals. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/ for both counts.

16th Case: Grewals Ltd

Date case filed: 22 November 2022

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety and health of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs7,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

17th Case: Ace Building Contractor Ltd

Date case filed: 31 July 2025

Count I: Failing to ensure that stairs of ladders are provided to enable persons gain access from one level of a scaffold to another level. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to ensure that the scaffold is effectively braced by means of a longitudinal and transverse bracing system. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-

Count III: Failing to ensure that every side of a work platform from which a person is liable to fall more than 2 metres is provided with toe-boards and 2 or more guard rails. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

18th Case: Dineshchandra Ocean Infra Ventures Ltd

Date case filed: 31 July 2025

Count I: Failing to cause an open side of a building from which a person is liable to fall a distance of more than 2 metres, to be adequately fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to cause an opening in stairways from which a person is liable to fall to be adequately fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/ for both counts.

19th Case: Etienne Margetson

Date case filed: 31 July 2025

Count I: Failing to ensure that stairs of ladders are provided to enable persons gain access from one level of a scaffold to another level. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to ensure that the scaffold is effectively braced by means of a longitudinal and transverse bracing system. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/ for both counts.

20th Case: Hotel Chambly Limited

Date case filed: 31 July 2025

Count I: Failing to notify the Director, National Occupational Safety and Health Department by the quickest practicable means of an accident at work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to send a report as per the Thirteenth Schedule of the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/ for both counts .
