1st Case: Sheikh Yousouf Caunhye

Count I: Failing to cause open sides of roof to be fenced under construction. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

2nd Case: Super Construction Co. Ltd (G.S Steel Ltd)

Count I: Failing to cause open sides of scaffold to be fenced under construction. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3rd Case: World Knits Ltd

Count I: Failing to ensure there was sufficient number of appointed persons to provide adequate coverage at all times regarding first aid at its lodging accommodation. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,500/- and cost of Rs100/-.

4th Case: Super Construction Co. Ltd

Count I: Using a building as lodging accommodation without a Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs700/- and cost of Rs200/-.

- Count II: Failing to hold a Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

11th Case: Renfort Ltd

Count I: Failing to record in a register the significant findings of assessment carried out under section 10(1) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.
