Cases in which judgement delivered**1st Case: Purple Ridge Limited**

Date case filed: 25 March 2025

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

2nd Case: TopBuilder Co Ltd

Date case filed: 27 August 2025

Count I: Failing to ensure that a metal scaffold exceeding 15 metres in height is put to use unless the scaffold has been examined by a Registered Professional Engineer after erection and a certificate is issued by the Registered Professional Engineer. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3rd Case: TopBuilder Co Ltd

Date case filed: 27 August 2025

Count I: Failing to provide ladders or stairs to enable person to gain access from one level of scaffold to the next. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

4th Case: Beijing Construction Engineering Group Co Ltd

Date case filed: 27 August 2025

Count I: Failing to ensure that any work platform does not have opening. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to ensure that any plank, which forms part of the scaffold platform do not rest on at least 3 supports. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

5th Case: Beijing Construction Engineering Group Co Ltd

Date case filed: 29 September 2025

Count I: Failing to employ at least one Safety and Health Officer on a full-time basis. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

6th Case: Maison M Ltee

Date case filed: 29 September 2025

Count I: Any employer shall not cause a scaffold, except an excluded scaffold, to be constructed, erected, installed, re-positioned, maintained, altered, repaired or dismantled unless he holds a permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

7th Case: Best Construct Ltd

Date case filed: 17 January 2023

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety and health of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs20,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

8th Case: Gokhool Engineering Co Ltd

Date case filed: 31 August 2022

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all its employees. Case dismissed.

9th Case: Cilandro Ltd

Date case filed: 22 October 2025

Count I: Failing to examine the refrigeration plant of make Tecumsek bearing serial number AJ2ZM1JF704 by a Registered Machinery Inspector. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to examine the refrigeration plant of make Tecumsek bearing serial number AJ2ZM1JF704 by a Registered Machinery Inspector. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/ for both counts.
