Date case filed: **30 September 2020**

Count I: Failing to carry out a fire drill at least once a year. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3rd Case: Boulangerie & Patisserie L'Amiral Co Ltee

Date case filed: **15 September 2020**

Count I: Operating a factory without it being registered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

4th Case: Nivra Enterprises Limited

Date case filed: **17 December 2020**

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

5th Case: Abdool Siddick Motalah Bucktowar

Date case filed: **18 February 2021**

Count I: Failing to cause every open side of building from which persons are liable to fall a distance of more than 2 metres to be adequately fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

6th Case: E.A.S. Ltd

Date case filed: **25 February 2021**

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

7th Case: B.D.C. (Plastic Industry Limited)

Date case filed: **14 September 2020**

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

8th Case: JIF (Mauritius) Private Limited

Count I: Failing to make a suitable and sufficient assessment of any risk to the safety and health to which any employee is exposed whilst he is at work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/-.

Count II: Operating a factory without it being registered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005 – Act No. 28 of 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

13th Case: Rassam Co Ltd

Date case filed: **27 January 2021**

Count I: Operating a factory without it being registered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005 – Act No. 28 of 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

14th Case: Sundaram Roche Carri Ltd

Date case filed: **27 January 2021**

Count I: Operating a factory without it being registered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005 – Act No. 28 of 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

Count III: Failing to forward a written record of proceedings of a Safety and Health Committee. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

17th Case: Navitas Holdings Ltd

Date case filed: **04 December 2020**

Count I: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/-.

Count II: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

18th Case: Fortress Marketing Company Ltd

Date case filed: **27 January 2021**

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs8,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

19th Case: La Moisson Ltee

Date case filed: **05 December 2017**

Count I: Failing to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of all its employees. Information dismissed.
