Count II: Failing to carry out a fire drill. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,500/-.

Count III: Failing to establish a Safety and Health Committee. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs1,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

5<sup>th</sup> Case: Cutchee Maiman Society

Count I: Failing to ensure that building is in sound construction and kept in good state of

repair. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.
