1st Case: The District Council of Pamplemousses

Count I: Failing to ensure safety and health of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs10,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

2<sup>nd</sup> Case: La Vanille Crocodile Park Ltd

Count I: Failing to provide a device that would prevent the operator from coming into

contact with the dangerous part. Count I was dismissed.

Count II: Failing to make available to the Permanent Secretary record to be kept under

the Act. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3<sup>rd</sup> Case: Mauritius Institute of Training and Development

Count I: Failing to provide and maintain a working environment that is safe and without

risks. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,500/-.

Count II: Operating a system comprising of conductors likely to give rise to danger

without the conductors being suitably covered with insulating material. Was

sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.
