### 1<sup>st</sup> Case: Sujeet Kumar Virapin

Count I: Employing a child for work. PG – Hearing held – Judgement on 10 February 2015. Accused was granted a conditional discharge to be of good behaviour for 12 months failing which to undergo 3 months imprisonment. Accused is to furnish 1 surety in the sum of Rs5,000/- and a recognizance in his own name in the sum of Rs25,000/-. Was sentenced to a cost of Rs100/-.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Case: Kuros Construction Solutions Ltd

- Count I: Failing to ensure that every platform of a scaffold is boarded in such a way as to prevent tools and materials from falling through. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to ensure that the scaffold is of good construction. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> Case: Aluminium Glass Industries Ltd

Count I Failing to ensure Safety and Health of employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs10,000/- and cost of Rs500/-.

### 4<sup>th</sup> Case: Paper Plus Ltd

Count I: Failing to ensure Safety and Health of employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs6,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

#### 5<sup>th</sup> Case: Kistnen Enterprises Ltd

Count I: Contravening a direction given by the Permanent Secretary. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

#### 6<sup>th</sup> Case: Superconstruction Ltd

Count I Using lodging accommodation without ELA permit. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

### 7<sup>th</sup> Case: Jet's Villa Ltd

Count I Failing to make risk assessment. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-. Was dismissed.

## 8<sup>th</sup> Case: Sotravic Const Ltd

Count I: Failing to provide PPE. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

### 9<sup>th</sup> Case: Bob Const Ltd

- Count I: Failing to provide PPE. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to cause open sides of building to be fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

## 10<sup>th</sup> Case: IPC

Count I Failing to make a risk assessment. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

## 11<sup>th</sup> Case: Modern Jurassic Building & Const Ltd

- Count I: Failing to notify accident. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to send report of accident. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

### 12<sup>th</sup> Case: Leal Equipment Cie Ltd

Count I Case strike out.
