## <u>ANNEX</u>

1<sup>st</sup> Case: Ramlo Ltee

Count I: Failing to ensure that no person is allowed to use a scaffold which is only

partially constructed unless it is made safe for use. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs2,500/-.

Count II: Failing to ensure that a prominent warning notice is affixed near any point at

which a scaffold is liable to be approached for use. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

2<sup>nd</sup> Case: Grand Bay Medical and Diagnostic Centre

Count I: Failing to carry out a fire drill at least once a year. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3<sup>rd</sup> Case: Evaco Construction Ltd

Count I: Failing to ensure safety at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs8,000/-.

Count II: Failing to notify Director, Occupational Safety and Health of an accident by

quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of

Rs200/- for both counts.

4<sup>th</sup> Case: Mauritius Institute of Training and Development

Count I: Requiring employees to work in place of work without a fire certificate being in

force. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/-.

Count II: Failing to carry out a fire drill at least once a year. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.
