1st Case: Palmar Limitee

Count I: Failing to ensure so far as is reasonably practicable the safety, health and

welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs30,000/-.

Count II: Failing to notify forthwith the Director, Occupational Safety and Health by

quickest practicable means of an accident at work. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs3,000/-.

Count III: Failing to send a report of the accident to the Director, Occupational Safety and

Health within 7 days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs500/-

for the three counts.

2nd Case: Parboteeah Raj

Count I: Failing to cause open sides on floor of building from which persons are liable to

fall to be adequately fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of

Rs200/-.

3rd Case: Phoenix Beverages Limited

Count I Failing to ensure safety, health and welfare of its employees. Was sentenced to

a fine of Rs12.000/- and cost of Rs300/-.

4th Case: Saint Aubin Limitee

Count I: Permitting employees to work in a place of work in respect of which a fire

certificate was required without such certificate being in force. Was sentenced

to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

5th Case: Sahaboo Noodles Co Ltd

Count I: Failing to hold a Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

6th Case: Kasa Textiles Ltd

Count I Failing to ensure that persons not in its employment is not exposed to any risk

to his safety. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs10,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

7th Case: Plasticon Ltd

Count I Failing to provide a system of work that is safe. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs10,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

8th Case: Island Resorts Ltd – The Oberoi Mauritius

Count I: Failing to ensure safety and health of employees. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs45,000/- and cost of Rs500/-.

9th Case: Fit U Garments Ltd

Count I: Requiring employees to work in a place of work where a fire certificate is

required without such certificate being in force. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

Societe Mehdreen

Count I Failing to apply for a fire certificate. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and

cost of Rs200/-.

10th Case: National Computer Board

Count I: Failing to review risk assessment. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and

cost of Rs200/-.

11th Case: FAIL

Count I: Failing to ensure that any person not in its employment is not exposed to risk to

his safety or health. Case was dismissed.
