Rs200/- for both cases.

Count I: Failing to ensure safety and health of employees. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

6<sup>th</sup> Case: Livestock Feeds Ltd

Count I: Failing to ensure safety and health of employees. Case was dismissed.

7<sup>th</sup> Case: The District Council of Grand Port
