1st Case: Entreprise Georges Chaw Mien Limited

Date case filed: **17 February 2022**

Count I: Failing, so far as is reasonably practicable, to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs9,000/-.

Count II: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/-.

Count III: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs500/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

2nd Case: Bread Lover' Corner Bakery Co Ltd

Date case filed: **09 October 2020**

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3rd Case: J.K. Construction & Son Ltd

Date case filed: **22 December 2021**

Count I: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/-.

Count II: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

4th Case: Jack & Line Ltd

Date case filed: **22 December 2021**

Count I: Causing a scaffold, except an excluded scaffold, to be constructed, erected, installed, re-positioned, altered, maintained, repaired or dismantled without holding a permit or enlisting the services of a scaffold contractor. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

5th Case: Mary Sarah Jane Lafleur

Date case filed: **10 February 2021**

Count I: Operating a factory without it being registered. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

6th Case: Rezkho and Company Limited

Date case filed: **25 February 2021**

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.

7th Case: Pharmacie Nouvelle Limited

Date case filed: **14 October 2020**

Count I: Failing to make a suitable and sufficient risk assessment. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/-.

Count II: Failing to provide and maintain any system of work that is safe and without risks to health. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,500/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

8th Case: Forges Tardieu Limited

Date case filed: **03 November 2015**

Count I: Failing to ensure that persons not in its employment is not exposed to any risk to his safety. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs10,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

9th Case: Akhilesh International Ltd

Date case filed: **10 February 2021**

Count I: Operating a factory without it being registered under the Occupational Safety and Health Act 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

10th Case: Viking Construction Ltd

Date case filed: **10 December 2021**

Count I: Causing a scaffold, except an excluded scaffold, to be erected without holding a permit or enlisting the services of a scaffold contractor. Was sentenced to a fine of 15,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

11th Case: Castel A.S.K. Metal Workshop Co Ltd

Date case filed: **28 March 2022**

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of the building. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

12th Case: Aquarelle Clothing Limited

Date case filed: **19 August 2021**

Count I: Failing, so far as is reasonably practicable, to ensure the safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs8,000/-.

Count II: Failing to notify an accident by the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/-.

Count III: Failing to send a report of an accident within seven days. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.
