(ii) Judgement was delivered in 4 cases for a total of 5 counts: -

1st Case: Societé SQL Ltée

Count I: Failing to carry out a fire drill according to an established fire and emergency plan approved by the Mauritius Fire and Rescue Service at least once a year at a place of work where a fire certificate is required. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs8,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

2nd Case: Boulangerie & Patisserie Paul Toureau Ltd

Count I: Locating a lodging accommodation in same building as place of work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs7,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

3rd Case: S.A.I. Building Civil & Gross Mechanical Engineering Contractors Ltd

- Count I: Failing to cause open sides to be fenced.
- Count II: Failing to cause opening in stairway sides to be fenced. Case was dismissed.

4th Case: Mauritius Institute of Training and Development

Count I: Failing to ensure that any part of building be kept in good state of repair. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs7,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.
