Count I: Failing to ensure safety, health and welfare of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs10,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

7th Case: Quality Builders Co Ltd

Count I: Failing to ensure safety, health and welfare of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs10,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

8th Case: Gokhool Eng & Const Co Ltd

- Count I: Failing notify accident. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs7,000/-.
- Count II: Failing to submit report of accident. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs7,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

Count I: Failing to make a risk assessment. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

10th Case: L. Mooken Building and Civil Engineering Works Ltd

Count I: Failing to cause platform of scaffold to be boarded. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.
