1st Case: One Way Const Ltd

Count I: Failing to cause opening in stairway to be fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

2nd Case: Goldox Const Ltd

Count I: Contravening a direction given by the Permanent Secretary. Was sentenced to

a fine of Rs2,000/-.

Count II: Failing to provide means for ensuring the safety and health of persons where

there is a risk of fall of more than 2 meters. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs2,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

3rd Case: Yanni Rice Specialist Ltd

Count I: Requiring employees to work in a place of work where a fire certificate is

required without such certificate being in force. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs7,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

4th Case: Tamak Textiles

Count I: Failing to appoint first aider. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs2,000/- and cost of

Rs200/-.

5th Case: Mauritius Meat Authority

Count I: Failing to ensure safety and health of employees. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs10,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

6th Case: Grewals (Mtius) Ltd

Count I: Failing to carry out fire drill at least once a year at its place of work according to

an established fire and emergency plan approved by the Mauritius Fire and

Rescue Service. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

7th Case: Le Texuma Co. Ltd

Count I: Failing to hold a Lodging Accommodation Permit. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs10,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.
