1st Case: Accused No. 1: Belle Mare Beach Development Company Ltd

Date case filed: 04 August 2017

Count I: Failing to ensure that any person not in his employment is not exposed to any

risk to his safety or health. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of

Rs200/-.

Accused No. 2: Systems Building Contracting Ltd

Date case filed: 04 August 2017

Count I: Failing, so far as is reasonably practicable, to ensure the safety, health and

welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs6,000/- and cost

of Rs200/-.

2nd Case: **Family World Ltd**

Date case filed: 24 August 2017

Count I: Failing, so far as is reasonably practicable, to ensure the safety, health and

welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs20,000/- and

cost of Rs200/-.

3rd Case: **Terrarock Ltd**

Date case filed: 07 July 2020

Count I: Failing to securely fence dangerous part of a machinery. Was sentenced to a

fine of Rs5,000/-.

Count II: Failing to securely fence dangerous part of a machinery. Was sentenced to a

fine of Rs5.000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

4th Case: C-Care (Mauritius) Ltd

Date case filed: 04 August 2017

Count I: Using a building as a lodging accommodation for its employees without holding

a Lodging Accommodation. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3.000/- and cost of

Rs200/-.

Filature de Riche Terre 5th Case:

Date case filed: 11 November 2016

Count I: Failing to ensure safety, health and welfare at work of its employees. The

> Magistrate dismissed the case against the Accused on the ground that the worker was of an imprudence which is so "grossière qu'elle fait disparaître, en realité, toute faute de la part de l'auteur (...)" and as such nullified the fault of the

and Health Act 2005. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/-

8th Case: Wayward Ltd

Date case filed: 09 October 2020

Count I: Failing to establish a Safety and Health Committee. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs3,000/-.

Count II: Failing to employ a Safety and Health Officer. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs3.000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

9th Case: Quality Beverages Limited

Date case filed: 28 April 2022

Count I: Failing to provide a device which automatically prevents the operator from

coming into contact with any dangerous part of any machinery where by reason of the nature of the operation such dangerous parts cannot be securely fenced.

Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3.000/-.

Count II: Failing to provide a device which automatically prevents the operator from

coming into contact with any dangerous part of any machinery where by reason of the nature of the operation such dangerous parts cannot be securely fenced.

Was sentenced to a fine of Rs3,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.
