constructed, erected or installed in accordance with the design and drawings of a Registered Professional Engineer. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs6,000/- and

cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

Rs6,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

by a Registered Professional Engineer after its construction and a certificate issued by the Registered Professional Engineer, in the form set out in the Third Schedule of the Occupational Safety and Health (Safety of Scaffolds) Regulations 2013, certifying that the scaffold is safe for use. Was sentenced to

a fine of Rs6.000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

a Lodging Accommodation Permit issued by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Human Resource Development and Training in respect of

Count I: Failing to notify an accident to the Director, Occupational Safety and Health by

the quickest practicable means. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost

of Rs200/-.

17th Case: Phoenix Beverages Limited

Date case filed: 14 December 2017

Count I: Failing to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and

welfare at work of its employees. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs16,000/- and

cost of Rs200/-.

18th Case: Complaints from the employees of Tourism Authority

Date case filed: 07 October 2020

Count I: Failing to make a suitable and sufficient assessment of any risk to the safety

and health to which any employee is exposed whilst he is at work. Was

sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/-.

sentenced to a fine of Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.
