fenced. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1.000/-.

Count III: Failing to cause the openings in the lift shaft on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor to be fenced. Was

sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for the three counts.

10<sup>th</sup> Case: Alteo Ltd

Count I: Failing to ensure safety and health of employees. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs5,000/- and cost of Rs200/-.

11th Case: Imbe Louis Richard

Count I: Failing to notify an accident at work. Was sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/-.

Count II: Failing to send a report to the Director, Occupational Safety and Health. Was

sentenced to a fine of Rs1,000/- and cost of Rs200/- for both counts.

12th Case: Renfort Ltd

Count I: Failing to keep record for risk assessment. Was sentenced to a fine of

Rs1,500/- and cost of Rs200/-.
